

Report on Save Lives In Sudan Campaign & Project

Introduction

The "Save Lives In Sudan" campaign was launched 20230424 by the board of the Swedish Sudanese Association that believed something had to be done in the acute situation that rapidly appeared after the outbreak of war in Sudan on 20230415. The campaign's goal has since the beginning been to provide aid to health facilities and centers throughout Sudan so they can continue to cure and save people's lives during the Sudan war.

Swedish-Sudanese Association invited several Sudan-related associations and opened the door for participation to all Sudanese and non-Sudanese organizations in Sweden that are interested in Sudan. As of now, we are multiple organizations working together, and more are welcome to join us.

After the campaign's launch, a specialized medical committee was formed, bringing together top experts in the health field both inside and outside of Sweden to assess needs. We have also collaborated with many organizations that work on medical matters inside and outside Sudan to help address various needs.

Initially, we attempted to purchase and deliver medicines, but we encountered significant logistical challenges in Sudan due to the ongoing war. These challenges included difficulties in ensuring safe delivery and proper storage conditions for medications.

During this time, we received many requests from various hospitals and health centers for electricity support due to widespread power outages. We all know the importance of electricity for hospitals and health centers to continue their operations and treatments, saving lives and preserving medicines.

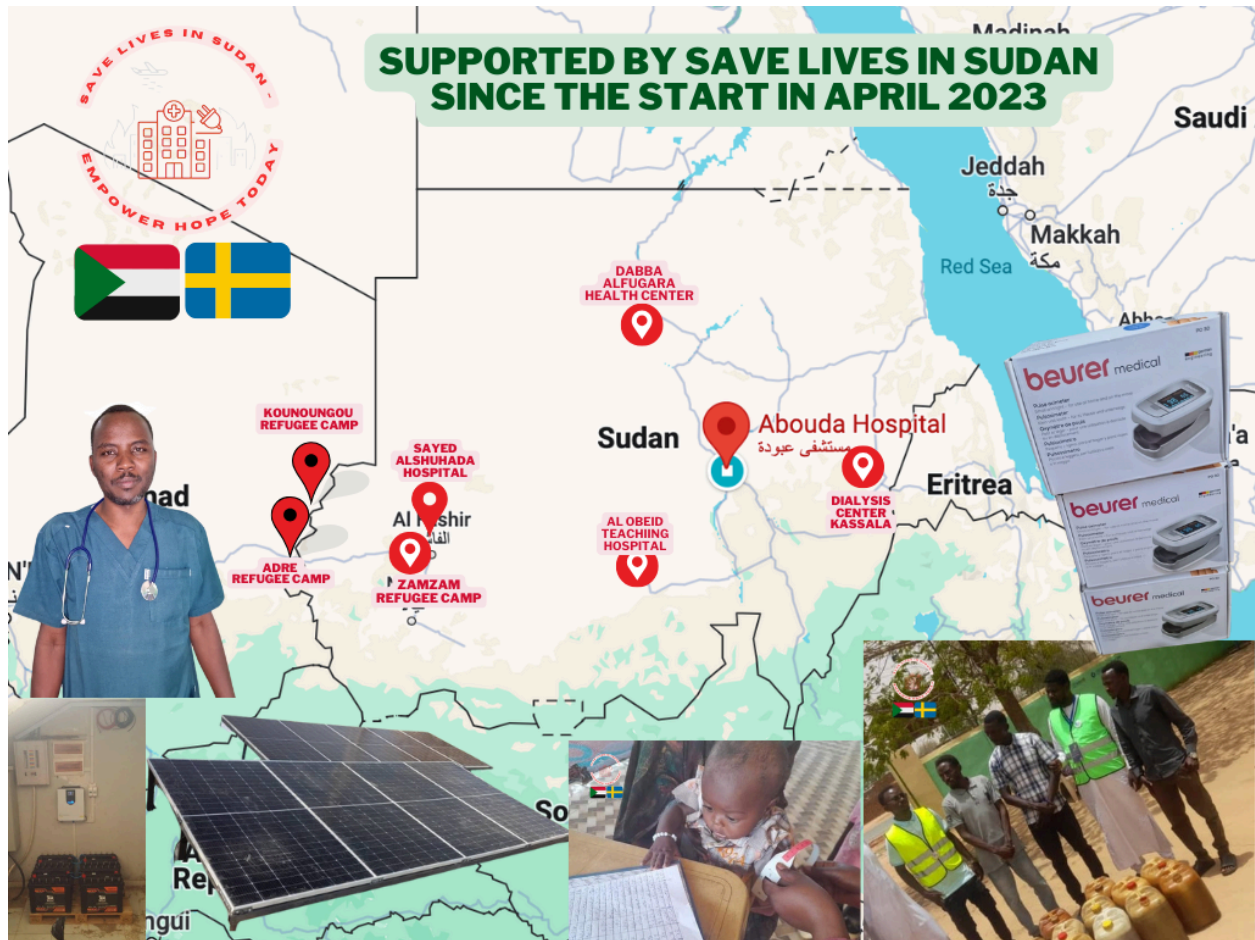
Many health centers and hospitals were forced to shut down, and numerous medicines were spoiled due to the lack of electricity. Consequently, the campaign decided to direct its support toward providing energy to health facilities, either by purchasing electricity, diesel for generators, or installing solar energy systems.

We faced major challenges in securing diesel due to rising costs and theft, so we shifted our focus to solar energy. Thankfully, we were able to form a technical committee made up of young Sudanese engineers and experts in Sweden, specializing in renewable energy production and storage. A solar energy module was designed by this technical committee, which is capable of powering essential

parts of health facilities, such as operating rooms, laboratories, pharmacies, or sections of dialysis centers.

Campaign Achievements and Projects:

Since April 2023, the "Save Lives In Sudan" campaign has been able to achieve several important milestones:



- Temporary energy provision to Aboudah Health Center, Omdurman:** This health center serves a large number of patients, providing a variety of clinics, including internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, surgery, dentistry, pharmacy, and laboratory services.
- Support to Sudanese Volunteers Organization (SVO):** Through our campaign partner SVO, we supported medical work for Sudanese refugees who fled from El Geneina and other areas of West Darfur to refugee camps in Chad. Medical equipment was purchased, and solar energy systems were installed in the Kounoungou refugee camp in eastern Chad.

- **Support to Sudanese doctors initiative in Chad:** We provided a solar energy system needed during medical field campaigns in camps for displaced people along the Sudan-Chad border (Adre, near the Sudanese border).
- **Installation of a solar power station at Kassala Reference Hospital:** We installed a solar energy unit (6.2 kW) at the dialysis center of the Kassala Reference Hospital, which is the only dialysis facility in Kassala state, eastern Sudan.
- **Saved Sayed al-Shuhada Health Center, El Fasher:** This health center is the cornerstone of health services in southern El Fasher and the surrounding rural areas. It provides healthcare to 17 neighborhoods in El Fasher and eight shelter centers in Zamzam Refugee Camp. Thanks to the donors of the "Save Lives In Sudan" campaign, we were able to respond quickly to the emergency call from Sayed al-Shuhada Health Center. By providing 14 diesel tanks, we were able to keep the center operational for two weeks. Subsequently, we installed three solar energy units, covering 75% of the center's electricity needs. Through our partner, Darfur Association in Sweden, volunteers in France sponsored the remaining 25%. Through this installation, Sayed al-Shuhada Health Center is fully powered by solar energy (20.8 kW) and continues to provide health services. The center was upgraded to a hospital and was then the only functioning hospital in southern El Fasher after the bombing of the Children's Hospital and other hospitals in the region.
- **Dabba Alfugara Health Center, Al Dabba, Northern State:** Installation of a solar power station (6.2 kW) at Dabba Alfugara Health Center in Northern State on the 5th of January 2025, that covers most of their critical electricity needs. After the installation it was then the only health center in the city that had stable continuous electricity.
- **HumoCare Health Center, Zamzam Refugee Camp, Northern Darfur:** Installation of a solar power station (6.2 kW) at HumoCare Health Center in Zamzam Refugee Camp (Northern Darfur) on the 16th of January 2025, that covers all their electricity needs.
- **El Obeid Teaching Hospital, Northern Kordufan:** Installation of a solar power station (5.2 kW) for the Emergency Department of El Obeid Teaching Hospital. Completed on the 11th of February 2025.

Campaign Financial Report:

Revenue:

Allocations:

Total allocations to date amount to **447,116 SEK**, broken down as follows:

1. Aboudah Health Center in Omdurman: **17,000 SEK**
2. Sudanese Doctors' Initiative in Chad (Adre refugee camp): **14,500 SEK**
3. Field hospital (SVO) in Kounungo refugee camp: **30,204 SEK**
4. Dialysis center at Kassala Reference Hospital (1 solar energy unit): **43,666 SEK**
5. Sayed al-Shuhada Hospital (diesel for two weeks): **11,470 SEK**
6. Sayed al-Shuhada Hospital (3 solar energy units): **156,690 SEK**
7. Dabba Alfugara Health Center (1 solar energy unit): **45,018 SEK**
8. HumoCare Health Center (1 solar energy unit): **71,191 SEK**
9. El Obeid Teaching Hospital (1 solar energy unit): **57,377 SEK**

Total Allocations since April 2023: 447,116 SEK

Remaining Funds:

- **184,390 SEK** remains in the Swedish-Sudanese Association's account in Sweden (Save Lives in Sudan fundraising).
- **167,337 Sudanese pounds** remain with SVO in Sudan.
- **400 UAE Dirhams** remain with M. Hassan Al-Farjabi (SolarMan) in the UAE.
- **1,900,000 Sudanese pounds** donated, with M. Hassan Al-Farajabi (Solarman) in Sudan (Bankak).

Note. The Swedish Sudanese Association (SSA) and the campaign does not take any charges or administration fees from any of the donated money. For each payment/donation via Swish, SSA pays around 2.50 SEK from its own account, which is the fee the bank SEB charges for organizational Swish accounts. For each international payment to the contractor, SSA pays around 300 SEK in bank fees from its own account. All bank fees are paid by SSA and not taken from the donations.

Future Plans:

The following health centers / hospitals have been approved by the steering committee of Save Lives In Sudan (as of 24 December 2025) and are currently under review by the engineering committee.

1. River Nile / Abuhamad: Abuhamad Teaching Hospital
2. Al Gezira / Elhosh: Elhosh Specialist Hospital
3. South Kordofan / Kadugli city: Kadugli Children's Hospital
4. South Darfur / Nyala: Nyala Specialised Hospital
5. Central Darfur / Nertiti Health Center, Jebel Marra

The medical committee remains in constant communication with their medical colleagues in Sudan and other regions to assess changing needs. We have also received applications for the installation of solar energy systems in the following critical health centers (all under review by the medical committee):

1. Al Gezira / Wadelmahi village: Elshaikh Abdelrahman Medical Center
2. Al Gezira / Wadelfadni: Elsheed Osman Health Center
3. Al Gezira / Hassahisa: Hassahisa General Hospital
4. Al Gezira / Wad Nouman: Wad Nouman Hospital
5. Al Gezira / Kamlin: Kab Aljedad Rural Hospital
6. Al Gezira / Kamlin - Um dugrasi village: Um dugrasi health center
7. Al Gezira / East Al Gezira: Um Shanishin Village Health Center
8. Al Gezira / East Al Gezira: Alhilaliya Hemodialysis Center
9. Khartoum North Bahry / Alsafiya: Haj Alsafi Hospital
10. Khartoum / Sharg Elnil: Albanjadeed Hospital
11. Khartoum / Al Shajara: Al Shajara Medical Center
12. Blue Nile / Damazin: Seraio Hospital
13. White Nile / Rabak: Rabak Teaching Hospital
14. North Darfur / Alaaait: Alaaait Rural Hospital
15. River Nile / Atbara: Ambakol Medical Center
16. River Nile / Almatamma: Almatamma Teaching Hospital
17. River Nile / Almatamma: Al-Jakeika Hospital for Emergency & Trauma

Other areas of similar need include: Al Managil, Kulbus, Abu Qamra (Al-Geneina border), Sennar, Port Sudan, and Gedaref.

Conclusion

The need for electricity in hospitals and health centers throughout Sudan is immense and ongoing, especially in the current war situation. We aim to continue to provide sustainable solutions that will help medical staff continue their work in treating and saving the lives of those affected by this war. Solar energy is

considered the optimal solution to ensure the availability of electricity, especially with the shortage of fuel to power generators, which has caused the closure of many hospitals and health centers across Sudan since the outbreak of war in April 2023.

In conclusion, we thank all the donors for the success of this campaign, as we raised over half a million SEK, all of which goes to serve the Sudanese people. Please continue to support the campaign and raise awareness about it. We believe in the importance of cooperation and participation from all engaged in helping people in Sudan. We believe in the principle of unified actions in the struggle for better living- and survival conditions, and this strategy has successfully brought together Sudanese and Sudan supporters from around the world.
